
















## Air/Kiln Dried Timber Stock List

<p><b>Ash</b> (<i>Fraxinus Excelsior</i>)</p>		<p>Light coloured, with coarse grain, not durable if used externally. Larger trees have a darkish heart. Traditionally used for hand tool handles and coach building.</p>
<p><b>Beech</b> (<i>Fagus Sylvatica</i>)</p>		<p>Pale coloured with some reddish heart. Stable when dry and works well. Not durable for exterior use. We can supply joinery grade and frame makers grade F.A.S quality.</p>
<p><b>Beech s/edge</b> (<i>Fagus Sylvatica</i>)</p>		<p>A lightly steamed German prime quality square edged Beech. Pre sanded 2.45m – 3.0m long and wide widths.</p>
<p><b>Cedar of Lebanon</b> (<i>Cedrus Libani</i>)</p>		<p>Heartwood is strongly scented, light brown in colour and durable. Often used for drawer sides. Becoming rare.</p>
<p><b>Cherry</b> (<i>Prunus Avium</i>)</p>		<p>Home grown Cherry has an interesting and varied grain and pattern. The heartwood is pale pinkish-brown occasionally with a green streak.</p>
<p><b>Cherry American</b> (<i>Prunus Serotina</i>)</p>		<p>Red to reddish-brown colour, suitable for furniture making.</p>
<p><b>Chestnut Sweet</b> (<i>Castanea Sativa</i>)</p>		<p>Yellow-brown straight grained timber. Durable and much sought after for fine joinery and kitchen cabinets.</p>
<p><b>Elm</b> (<i>Ulmus Priocera or Glabra</i>)</p>		<p>Brown and distinctive with varied grain and finish. Durable and rare. Wider sapwood can make a distinctive contrast.</p>

<p><b>Lime</b> (<i>Tilia Vulgaris</i>)</p>		<p>Cream yellow maturing yellow brown to pale brown. Popular with wood carvers.</p>
<p><b>Maple American Hard</b> (<i>Juglans Saccharum</i>)</p>		<p>Cream to pale red colour. High strength and resistant to shock.</p>
<p><b>Oak European Prime</b> (<i>Quercus Sessiliflora</i>)</p>		<p>For long lengths and straight grain with few knots we suggest this prime square edged stock. We keep Prime grade squares with bored centres for stability.</p>
<p><b>Oak English Prime</b> (<i>Quercus Robur</i>)</p>		<p>English Oak (usually pendunculate) has much variety of grain and pattern. Heartwood is light tan to biscuit coloured. (Note: larger thicknesses are kilned to 18-20% or well air dried).</p>
<p><b>Oak Pippy</b> (<i>Quercus Robur</i>)</p>		<p>Colour as for Prime Oak but including some small knots with appearance of 'cat's paw' and some boards may include larger clusters.</p>
<p><b>Oak Character</b> (<i>Quercus Robur</i>)</p>		<p>Colour as for Prime Oak but including some larger knots and grain pattern and also shakes/splits not found in Prime grade timber.</p>
<p><b>Sapele</b> (<i>Entandrophragma</i>)</p>		<p>Reddish brown with marked and regular stripe. Moderately durable.</p>
<p><b>Sycamore</b> (<i>Acer Pseudoplatanus</i>)</p>		<p>White and easy to work. End raked and kilned straight away after sawing to keep the white colour and to ensure stability. Smooth finish, sometimes a figured grain.</p>
<p><b>Utile</b> (<i>Entandrophragma Utile</i>)</p>		<p>Similar to Sapele but with darker shade and without stripes.</p>

<p><b>Walnut</b> (<i>Juglans Regia</i>)</p>		<p>Good boards of this wild patterned dark wood are difficult to find. Usually for gun cabinets, gunstocks etc.</p>
<p><b>Walnut American Black</b> (<i>Juglans Nigra</i>)</p>		<p>Light grey to chocolate purplish brown giving and excellent colour and finish.</p>
<p><b>Yew</b> (<i>Taxus Baccata</i>)</p>		<p>Very fine grained and a dense reddish colour with a wide white sap. Usually quite small planks with faults, not all of which should be considered defects.</p>
